Native animals join in classes

ORPHANED native animals were a hit with a group of Busselton Senior High School students when they joined them in a classroom at Wonnerup House.

Under the guidance of Conservation Volunteers officer Kate Montgomery the students were taking part in the environmental group's Earth Assist program.

Over the week they cleared litter and conducted a marine debris survey at Preston Beach, did hand-weeding on Wonnerup Beach, visited Bunbury's Dolphin Discovery Centre, Ambergate Reserve and the community nursery.

"Some of the students have shown a real interest, especially in the animals," Kate said.

"The aim is to introduce them to situations and people they wouldn't normally be exposed to."

At Wonnerup House DEC officer and FAWNA member Peter Vickridge talked about the diverse range on native animals in the South West, including many the students were unfamiliar with.

He then introduced a phascogale, a brush-tail possum and a pair of wallaby joeys which he has been fostering, allowing the students to hold and interact with the animals.
